



1. Trace design onto origami paper, felt or other surface. If you want enough material to fold the top over a string or ribbon, include the part with the dotted line.
2. Cut out white parts with sharp scissors or craft knife. Be sure not to cut through dark parts!
3. Use a hole punch to make the eyes.
4. If you like, cut a small square of red cellophane or tissue paper to put behind hourglass shape.



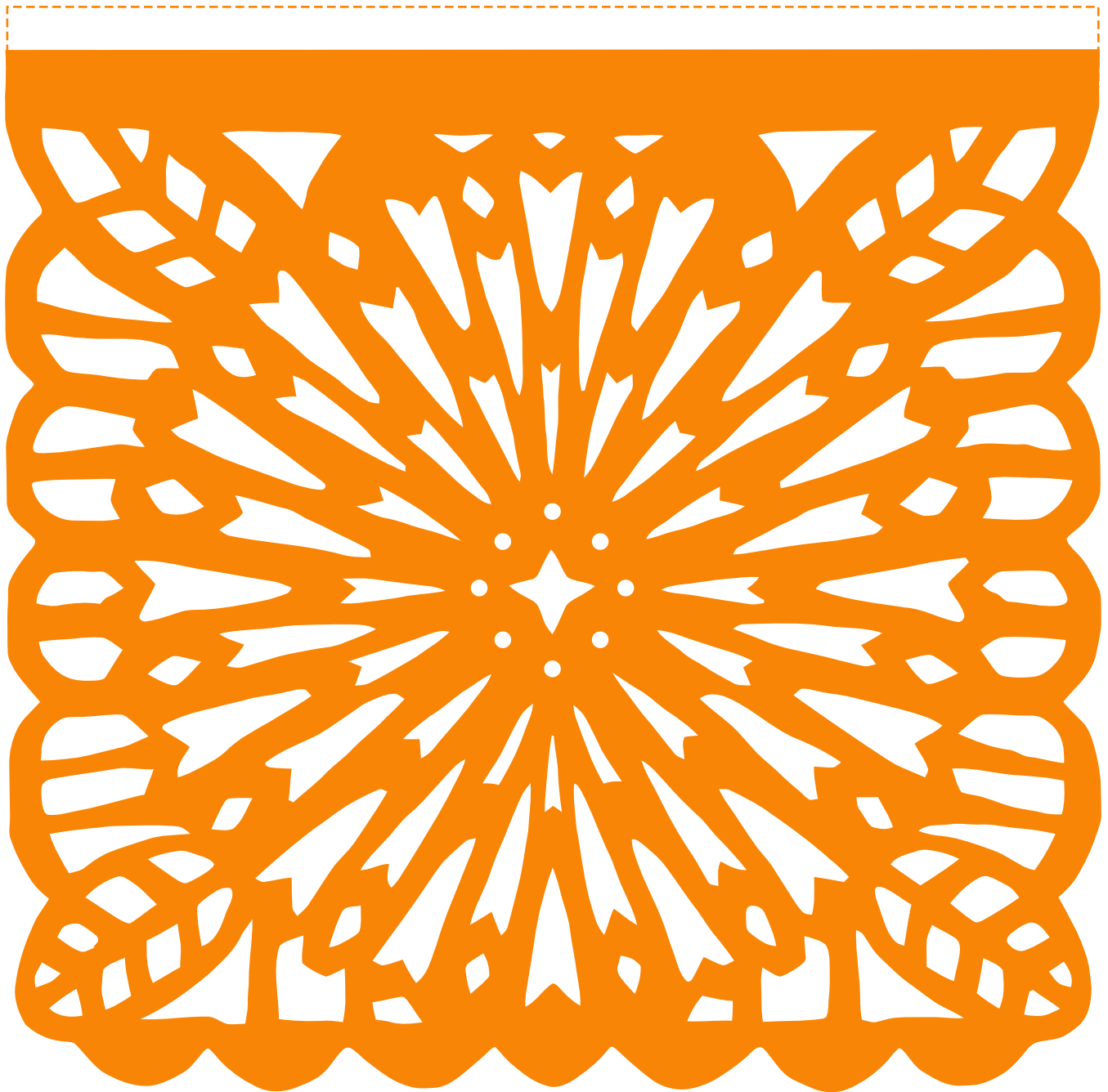

2. Cut out white parts with sharp scissors or craft knife. Be sure not to cut through dark parts! Since this design is symmetrical, you can just cut half the design on a piece of paper folded in half vertically, like making a paper snowflake, cut through both layers, then unfold it.
3. Use a hole punch to punch the circles at the center bottom.
